## Family Feud and Wheels for Wiesenreder

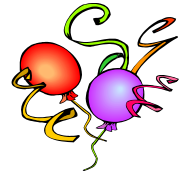

## Notice Regarding Agency Fee Payers

Agency Fee Payers are any staff members who declare in writing their objection to any expenditure made by the local or its affiliates (NYSUT/NEA) for activities or causes of political or ideological nature only incidentally related to the terms and conditions of employment. Parties wishing to pursue this must declare in writing their objection and wish to become an Agency Fee Payer during the time period of June 1st to July 1st, 2010.

You may request to review a copy of the NYSUT and NEA Consolidated Schedule of Expenses and Allocation Between Chargeable and Non-chargeable Expenses for the year ending August 31, 2009 by emailing [WTAPresident@wayneta.org](mailto:WTAPresident@wayneta.org)

Please note that by choosing to become an Agency Fee Payer you still pay dues however you lose the following rights:

- \* Membership in WTA
- \* Ability to attend any WTA meetings
- \* Ability to vote or give input into WTA changes or the creation of a new WTA contract
- \* Eligibility to hold or run for any offices in WTA or serve on any WTA committees
